



· Rendezvous, Joyce Crooks and Kathy Morgan – will have all the classes committed by next week.



### Tips by Char

**TIP: DOUBLE NEEDLE.** I do not know if any of you use a double (twin) needle when quilting, but if you do here are a couple of ways you can avoid problems. Instead of using 2 spools of thread with a double needle, fill a bobbin to hold the second needle thread. Stack the bobbin and spool of thread on the same spool pin with the bobbin on the bottom of the stack. (This is a great tip if it is 2:00 AM and you only have one spool of thread in the color you wish to use.) Second, have the spool unwinding from the front and bobbin unwinding from the back. In other words, counter clockwise and clockwise. Doing it this way, prevents the threads from twisting together.

**TIP: PINS+BAR OF SOAP.** What does that equation equal? An impromptu traveling pincushion. Leave the wrapping on a bar of soap that comes with a hotel room so the soap does not crumble. Stick the pins through the paper into the bar of soap. An extra bonus is the pins will slide into fabric more easily due to the soap coating. A win-win situation. **REMINDER:** I hope you all are participating in the Quilts of Valor 2023 block from May's tips. I hope to turn one in by July. A doctor's appointment may interfere with being at the June meeting.


As of May 10, 2023 we have made 133. We only have 3 more months to make 117 to reach SSQ goal of 250.
