H. **Website**, Cathy Cormack – check if list of books is on the website – and it is.


Adjourned the Business Meeting at 10:01. Gabi Mear moved and Eddie Davis seconded.


Tips by Char

TIP: WINDING BOBBINS. Wind bobbins at a MEDIUM SPEED. Set the speed control on your sewing machine at medium speed, turn on bobbin winder and fill your bobbin/s. Medium speed helps prevent the thread from stretching. If the thread stretches and then relaxes problems will be caused with proper stitch formation. Sometimes plastic bobbins will break from winding too fast. (I've had the top of the bobbin spin off while winding; what a mess!) No such problem when slowing the speed to medium.

TIP: FABRIC MEDIUM. Who among us doesn't look for a product which will perform more than one task. One such product is CLEAR Aloe Vera Gel. Besides soothing sunburns, it can also work as a fabric medium when blending fabric textile paint to increase color transparency. If any of you use Dewent Inktense pencils to provide a watercolor look to fabric painting the Positive Art Jacquard Fabric Textile Medium Colorless Extender is your go to fabric medium, but the CLEAR (not colored) Aloe Vera Gel is a good alternative. If either product is not available locally, check Amazon.

FYI: LID. Did you know that the lid from an 8 oz grated parmesan cheese jar fits a regular mouth mason canning jar? I have no idea how this tip applies to quilting, but one of you may find this tip useful.

Program: Dana Jones - Pagtinabangay: The Quilts and Quiltmakers of Caohagan Island

You'll be transported to a tiny island — just 13 acres — in the central Philippines as you enjoy images and stories of the colorful quilts and the more than 100 quiltmakers of Caohagan Island. You'll see photos of more than 50 of these handmade, one-of-a-kind quilts plus be introduced to the unique techniques developed by these quiltmakers whose tools are simply fabric and scissors, needle and thread. I spent more than a month on the island, quilted with the residents, went fabric shopping with them on nearby Cebu Island, and snorkeled the reef that surrounds Caohagan. Those who view the quilts come away smiling, inspired by the creativity of these women and men.

I DESIGNED "CIRCLE OF FRIENDS" AS A WAY OF TEACHING CHERYL PHILLIPS' SURPRISINGLY SIMPLE TECHNIQUE FOR INSETTING CIRCLES USING HER CUT -A-ROUND TOOL. YOU'LL MASTER INSETTING CIR-CLES INTO BLOCKS AND CIRCLES INTO CIRCLES US-ING JUST EIGHT PINS PER CIRCLE NO MATTER THE SIZE. YOU'LL MAKE THE FIRST BLOCK FOR THIS QUILT IN A FEW HOURS, THEN YOU'LL PERFECT THE TECHNIQUE SO BY THE END OF THE CLASS, YOU'LL HAVE MULTIPLE BLOCKS DONE — PERHAPS ENOUGH FOR A TABLE RUNNER. YOU'LL KNOW HOW TO CONTINUE MAKING BLOCKS FOR AS LARGE A QUILT AS YOU WANT. Christmas Stockings




