
# Orchard Stitchers

# Tips by Char

**TIP: BATTING** – Some of you still use a rolling pin for its intended baking use. A quilting use for your rolling pin is to smooth the batting after you take it from its packaging. Of course, another way to smooth the batting is to put into the clothes dryer on the air fluff setting.



TIP: ORPHAN BLOCKS – We all have orphan blocks; the sample blocks we made to test the directions of a quilt pattern or a new colorway for a quilt pattern. Now what? Use these blocks to make bowl cozies. Make sure the block is made from all cotton material and pieced with cotton thread and that the batting used for the cozy is all cotton. Why? Microwave! DO NOT use Insul-brite for the batting –it has metal in it. If you are using an orphan block to make a trivet, then you can use Insul-brite to protect your counter or table top.
