**Adjourn Business Meeting** – Pam Lewshenia moved, and Carla Alley seconded the motion and the meeting was adjourned at 9:50 am.





#### Tips by Char

TIP: STARCH. I've never given canned starch much thought, but many of you prefer starch to a starch alternate such as Best Press. If you want to use a quality starch, Faultless Premium Professional Luxe Finish Spray Starch is the one to purchase. Found at our local grocery stores and big box stores as well, look for the gold can. It is even available on Amazon. I know Heather Stadelman buys the gold can in quantity. She posted recently on Facebook. Many more of our professional quilters use the gold can. If you prefer to avoid an aerosol can, June Taylor has Starch Savvy in a spray bottle – another quality liquid starch.

TIP: FLATTENING THE SEAMS. Use a cotton swab dipped in liquid starch or starch alternative at the intersection of numerous quilt seams. Saturate the point where there is the most bulk with starch to give your iron more power to flatten the seams. For best results, press the seams open to reduce the bulk where numerous seams meet.

**TIP: TEAM QUILTING.** Sewing a quilt with friends means there should be consistent seams, but a ¼" seam may not be the same for everyone. If you are strip piecing using 2 ½" strips, cut a stitching guide of lightweight (cereal box) cardboard at a scant 2"x 6". Stitch one seam and press. Add the next strip right sides together, edges even and align the card board strip with the first stitching. Stitch along the cardboard. If done carefully, the group should be delighted with the accuracy. Maybe I should use the same technique just for me when I am stitching strips together. All my strips sewn consistently for my own projects. What a concept!
