# Tips by Char

**TIP: COPING STRIPS**. Working with panels in quilts can lead to sizing predicaments. Perhaps you wish to use individual panel pictures that vary in size to the pieced blocks you are using, or the panel section sizes were inconsistently printed or the rotary cutter slipped when cutting them apart. Use coping strips – fabric strips used to adjust the size of a section to fit the pieced area next to it. The coping strip could be added to one side only if that suits the guilt's design, but do not make the use of coping strips haphazard unless the quilt is wonky already. Some sections might be tall enough, but not wide enough or vice versa. Coping strips could and should be a useful technique when working with panels. (By the way, I was not familiar with the term coping strips. Even I learn from my tips!)

TIPS: STEAM. The key to using steam is PRESS. Do not iron a block or seam when using steam. Steam will stretch the fabric. FINGER PRESS before pressing with an iron to help prevent the "fold". LEADERS AND ENDERS. Using leaders and enders not only prevent your machine from eating the fabric, they also SAVE THREAD. And last, but not least, the BINDING is the frame for your quilt. Take your time adding the binding either by hand or by machine. Make sure the binding enhances the quilt and does not detract from it.

# Sunset Slope Quilters' By-Laws Revised Sept 2023 ARTICLE I – NAME:

The name of the club shall be Sunset Slope Quilters.

a 501(c) 4 non-profit organization. Sunset Slope Quilters may be referred to as SSQ in these bylaws and the Board Policies.

#### **ARTICLE II – PURPOSE:**

The purpose of Sunset Slope Quilters is to share our quilts through various outreach programs, perpetuate the rich heritage of quilting in America, and to promote the art and perfection of the craft.

### **ARTICLE III - MEMBERSHIP:**

**Section 1. Definitions and Limitations:** A member is defined as an individual whose current dues are paid. Membership is limited to anyone eighteen years or older and not restricted on the basis of race, nationality, or gender. Members will receive the newsletter.

**Section 2. Dues:** Annual dues are determined by the board and published in Board Policies. Dues for the next calendar year may be paid beginning in November. In order to be included in the annual printed membership directory, the member must pay dues no later than the January general meeting.

Section 3. Visitors: All visitors will be charged a fee per meeting as set in the Board Policies.

**Section 4. Sunset Slope Quilter's Membership Registration:** A member will not sell or share membership information for any reason. Membership in this club is not transferable or assignable.

Section 5. Release of liability: Each member agrees, as a condition of membership, to release and waive any claim he or she may have against the club, its officers, employees, committee members or agents arising out of a related to member's participation in activities of the club or arising out of any action taken by the club or its Board of Directors, including but not limited to discipline or expulsion of any member or officer.

#### RTICLE IV - OFFICERS:

Section 1. Officers shall be members of the club in good standing for at least one year.

Section 2. No member shall hold more than one elected office at one time.

**Section 3.** Officers of the club shall be president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer. In the event the club chooses to resume a raffle program, a 2nd vice president shall be elected to serve as games manager.

**Section 4.** Officers shall be elected to serve a one-year term. An individual may serve in a specific officer position for no more than three consecutive years.

Section 5. A background check, at the discretion of the board, may be required for any officer.

#### Section 6. Duties of Officers:

President: The president shall preside at all meetings of the club and the board and shall appoint all committee chairmen. At his or her discretion, after consulting with the board, he or she shall act on matters whenever they cannot be taken up at a general meeting. At no time may the president over-ride a board decision. Only a vote of the general membership may overturn a board decision. The president shall appoint the nominating committee as described in Article VI. Additional duties of the president may be listed in Board Policies.

Vice President: The vice president shall perform the duties of the president in case of the president's absence or disability. The Vice President shall serve as a Community Laison for SSQ managing activities within the communities of the Grand Valley and other quilting groups as determined by the board. Additional duties of the vice president may be listed in Board Polices.

2nd Vice President: In years when a raffle does takes place, a 2nd vice president will be elected. The 2nd vice president will be a trained Games Manager. The Games Manager's duties will include applying for raffle license, being a signer on raffle checking account, paying bona fide raffle expenses, filing quarterly reports to the Colorado Secretary of State's office, and following all rules as stated in the Colorado Constitution, Colorado Revised Statutes, Title 12, Article 9 of the Rules covering and regulating Bingo/Raffles. Monthly financial reports will be given at board and general meetings.

Secretary: The secretary shall keep a record of all meetings of the board and the club, including an attendance list for each meeting. He or she shall keep all records and copies of all correspondence pertaining to the organization on file. An annual book of minutes shall be maintained that contains a copy of the minutes from each board and general meeting, a copy of the By-Laws, Board Policies, and any amendments. This book shall be transferred annually to the new secretary. The books of minutes for five consecutive years shall be maintained in storage, The secretary shall publish the minutes from the general meeting in the newsletter. Additional duties of the secretary may be listed in Board Policies.

Treasurer: The treasurer shall keep a record of all money received and disbursed. He or she shall pay bills as approved by the board. He or she shall make provide a written report of the account balances at each board meeting in addition to a report which provides a status of spending against the annual budget. He or she shall provide a report of account balances at each general meeting. The treasurer shall publish the monthly and year to date account balances in the newsletter. In the event of his or her inability to act as treasurer, the president is authorized to make such payments and disbursements until a new treasurer can be appointed. The treasurer is responsible for filing a 990N federal tax return each year. Per IRS regulations, all financial records shall be stored in a safe place and kept for a period of seven years. Additional duties of the treasurer may be listed in Board Policies.

Section 7. All elected officers shall have voting privileges and they must regularly attend board meetings.

## **ARTICLE V – COMMITTEES:**

#### Section 1. Committees

SSQ will have the following committees: Barnes and Noble Fundraisers, Block of the Month, Christmas Stockings, Community Affairs, Library, Member Activities, Membership, Newsletter, Programs and Workshops, Quilt Show, and Rendezvous. Additional committees of SSQ and their duties may be established by the board and listed in the Board Policies.

#### Section 2. Duties of Committee Chair People:

Committee chair people will have voting rights and should regularly attend board meetings. If the chair person is unable to attend a board meeting, a committee member may serve and vote in his or her place.

#### ARTICLE VI - NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS:

**Section 1. Nominations:** The president shall appoint a Nominating Committee of three to five individuals to serve for one election period. A chairman shall be chosen by the committee members.

It is the duty of the Nominating Committee to prepare a slate of nominees for each office. Names may be presented from the general membership to the Nominating Committee for consideration on the slate. The chairman of the committee shall report the proposed slate at the September meeting. A full slate of at least one nominee for each office is required. Nominations will be accepted from the floor at the September meeting. Prior acceptance must be obtained from the nominee.

Nominees will be asked to submit a bio which will be published in the October newsletter.

Section 2. Elections: Elections shall be held at the October meeting. A simple majority of the members present shall elect.

**Section 3. Officer Installation:** The president exiting the office, or a past president if the current is serving another term or unavailable, shall install the new officers at the December Meeting. Those elected shall take office at the first board meeting after the December general meeting.

Section 4. Vacancies: Should a vacancy occur during the one-year term, the board shall appoint a member to fill that unexpired term. ARTICLE VII – MEETINGS:

**Section 1. General Meetings:** General meetings shall be held once a month. If School District 51 cancels classes due to inclement weather, the general meeting will also be cancelled. A simple majority of members present is required for all votes except for changes to the By-Laws as described in Article IX.

**Section 2. Board Meetings:** Board meetings shall be determined by the president. Board meetings are open to all members of SSQ. The board membership consists of the elected officers and the committee chair people as listed in these bylaws and the Board Policies by a majority of board members present at the meeting.

#### ARTICLE VIII – FUNDS and AUDIT:

**Section 1. Bank Account:** Arrangements with a bank shall require the signature of the president and the treasurer. The president or treasurer is authorized to write checks for the club. Neither the treasurer nor the president may write and sign a check to him or herself.

Section 2. Budget Expenditures: Any expenditure outside of the budget shall require board approval.

**Section 3. Audit:** An audit will be completed by the end of January for the previous year's accounts. The audit shall include the old and new president, old and new treasurer, and a minimum of one member who is not a member of the board.

A tax, accounting, or bookkeeping professional, who may or may not be a member of SSQ should review the prior year's financial reports a minimum of every two years.

#### **ARTICLE IX – AMENDMENTS:**

Any changes to the By-Laws must be presented inwriting to the board. The President will then appoint a By-Laws Committee to study the proposal(s). Then the By-Laws Committee will present any proposed changes to the board. The proposed amendments (s) will then be presented at a general meeting and printed in the next newsletter. Approval will be by a two/thirds majority of those in attendance at the next general meeting.

#### ARTICLE X – PARLIMENTRY AUTHORITY:

The current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, shall govern the organization in all cases not specified in these By-Laws. In the event of a conflict between Robert's Rules of Order and the By-Laws, these By-Laws shall prevail.

#### **ARTICLE XI – DISSOLUTION OF SUNSET SLOPE QUILTERS:**

The assets of the club remaining after payment of all debts and liabilities shall be distributed to one or more organization(s) recognized as exempt under Section 501(c) 3 of the Internal Revenue Code

**Note #1:** From Article IX- Amendments: (that has not been changed), "... the Bi-Laws committee will present any proposed changes to the board. (This was completed at the 9/6/23 meeting.) The proposed amendment(s) will then be presented at a general meeting (This was completed at the 9/13/23 general meeting.) and printed in the next newsletter. Approval will be by a two thirds majority of those in attendance at the next general meeting. (We will have any needed further discussion, a motion, and a vote at the 10/11/23 general meeting.) **Note #2:** The groups that make up the following committees will not be listed in the By-Laws but will be listed in the Board Policies. This allows the board to make changes as needed.

- · Communications: Emails, Sunshine Cards, Telephone Tree, Website, Facebook, Photographer
