




### Orchard Stitchers



### Tips by Char

**TIP: LONGARM QUILTERS.** Mirror tiles can be used to see underneath the quilt to check tension and stitch quality. Others have found using a door mirror is easier and faster to use as it is one piece to insert and remove as needed.

**TIP: BASEBALL CAP.** If your serger does not have a scrap catcher or you forgot it on the way to class, retreat, rendezvous, use a baseball cap turned upside down. Pull the serger to the front of the table, place the bill of the cap under the serger to anchor it and you are all set. (You could keep a cap in your vehicle just for this emergency.)

**TIP: NO BENDING OVER.** To clean the sewing floor without crawling around on your hands and knees, put a lint roller on a long paint roller stick. Roll it around the floor to pick up threads. No

crawling around and no bending over. **TIP: BATTING.** Just a reminder that the dimple side is the right side. The pimple side is the wrong side.



### Mesas to Monuments Quilt Show, April 12-13, 2024

We are now 6 months out from our quilt show April 12-13. We hope everyone has been busy making quilts and projects to show and donate. The M2M committee has been moving right along and is gearing up for our busy months.

Quilt Entries: Quilt entry applications for regular and vintage/antique quilts will be available at the December meeting and we will begin accepting completed forms and pictures in January. Forms are also on the website if you'd like to check out the categories. We will start by limiting ballroom entry quilts to 2 per member. (Note: SSQ specialty entries will be separate and not included in that count (i.e., round robin, BOM, workshop, for which space will be pretty limited. Antique quilts for the bed turning are also not included in that count.)

Hanging Sleeves: We will be hanging art and wall quilts with dowels in 2024, so there is a new requirement for a hanging sleeve to accommodate a 1-inch dowel (a 2-1/2 to 3-inch sleeve should work) for quilts around 45 inches wide or less.

Auctions: The small and large quilt auctions are important to fundraising and to ensure we have the funds available to move forward with the next quilt show (2026). We are very grateful for your donations of new or newer quilts. If you have questions, please contact Kris Murphy for small quilts (max 100-inch diameter) and Lisa Martin or Selah Chipman for large quilts.

Boutique: The Boutique would also appreciate your donations. The net funds from SSQ's Boutique go back to SSQ's reserves. Contact Joyce Crooks with questions.

Antique Bed Turning: The antique bed turning team would like some quilts from non-SSQ members. If you have a neighbor or a friend who has an antique quilt, please check with Joan Walker. There is no fee to have a quilt in the bed turning, but it does require an Antique/Vintage entry form. (Note: For 2024 we will be accepting antique quilts with recent quilting.)

Vendors: The vendor team has been very busy and we have only 7 booths remaining with several vendors interested. A huge thanks to Linda Roach, Jewell Buck, and Judy Kiser.

Volunteering: Jacque Weimer is our volunteer coordinator and will have sign-ups for jobs closer to and during the quilt show beginning in January.

Marketing: We really could use help with some specific marketing jobs. See Janet if you'd like to know more about those jobs. Getting the word out is extremely important. Too often after our last show we heard people say they didn't even know about our show.

Featured Quilt Artist: Rose has been busy working to bring us a featured artist, Ricky Tims. The plan is for a 1-1/2-hour lecture/presentation beginning 1:00 Saturday afternoon at a convention center classroom plus an entertainment feature Friday night with Ricky singing, talking, showing slides of his quilts, etc., off site. More information to follow.
